SAFETY AND HEALTH

In making this commitment to a safe and healthful place of work, we are aware of our legal responsibilities under the Health and Safety at Work Act, and associated regulations. Our aims will be achieved by managing risk to personnel, plant and process. This is a commercially valid strategy, which recognises the concept of Loss Control and duty of care to employees, visitors and all others who may be affected by what we do.

The management of risk is a line management responsibility, all employees have a significant role in assisting to meet this objective. It is our intention that all personnel will have clearly defined and understood responsibilities, which will include active participation in the review and implementation of policy, as appropriate. This will be achieved through high standards of instruction, supervision and training and by ensuring that communications pathways remain clear and open at all times.

It will be the particular responsibility of the management to set standards, to monitor and measure performances against those standards and to verify implementation of policy. In continuing to develop a safety management system we shall use our 'model' the HSE document, HS (G) 65, Successful Health and Safety Management.

I will continue to review progress and monitor change and will update policy whenever required to provide the necessary direction to ensure that all our standards and performance reflect the needs and aspirations of the Company and its personnel.

THE ENVIRONMENT

In making our commitment to preservation of the environment, it is our policy that all reasonable and practicable efforts will be made, consistent with regulatory requirements and prevailing industry practices, to conduct operations in a manner to minimise the risk to the environment.

This will be achieved through the identification and effective control of any emissions, effluents and discharges, which may arise as a result of our operations. We recognise that we have a duty of care to take all reasonable steps to look after any waste and prevent its illegal disposal by others.

I am confident that this policy will receive the enthusiastic support of all personnel, which is essential for its effective implementation.
